## LOOK, LISTEN, AND ASK

Tips for Choosing School Vacation and Summer Programs



Use this tip sheet as a guide when you visit to help you look at, listen for, and ask about key features of a quality program. Please note that because of the current pandemic, some programs may not be able to offer in-person tours or program visits at this time. In this case, you should discuss virtual tour options with programs you are considering.



- Look around the program. Are the building, materials, and equipment clean and in good repair? Is the space inviting and appropriate for school-age children?
- Look at the activity spaces. Are they well organized? Do they offer a variety of materials that children would find interesting?
- Look to see if children have a designated place to leave their belongings.
- Look to see if there are spaces where children can relax or have quiet time.



- Listen to how staff are interacting with the children. You should hear a positive, nurturing tone of voice at an appropriate volume level.
- If children are present, listen to the sounds in the program. Do you hear frequent laughter and conversations among the children?
- Notice the smells of program. Are they clean, pleasant smells or are they strong unpleasant odors?



- Ask if the program is licensed or accredited.
- Ask if the program offers an open house or scheduled tours (virtual or in-person).
- Ask about **education and training requirements for staff** (including CPR and First Aid). Are staff specifically trained to work with children and are they required to participate in ongoing training?
- Ask if program staff undergo background checks as a part of the hiring and screening process.
- Ask **how the program groups children**. How many adults are responsible for each group? Are there separate areas for different age or interest groups? Do age groups mix? How often?
- Ask how the program helps new attendees get oriented and become comfortable with participating.
- Ask if the program provides meals and snacks.
- Ask if **field trips are part of the program**. How are children supervised on field trips, including the time spent traveling to and from the location?
- If the program provides **transportation**, is a safe and reliable vehicle used? Is the driver licensed and insured? Are children properly restrained according to their height and weight?
- Ask how the program handles children who need to take medication while onsite.
- Ask about the activities offered. Can children choose which activities to participate in?
- Ask about their safety and supervision practices.
- Ask how the program handles challenging behaviors. How does it resolve conflict between children?
- Ask about the program's sick child policy. What does the program do if a child becomes sick onsite?
- Ask if water activities are a part of the program. How are children supervised during these activities and how is water safety enforced? What are their water safety procedures?
- If the program includes outside activities, ask when and how often children have access to drinking water, shade, and restrooms.
- Ask for a copy of the program's policies. Review information on billing, payments, pick-up procedures, safety, emergency planning, etc.
- Ask if the program accepts child care assistance or offers a sliding fee, discounts, or scholarships, if applicable.
- If your **child has a disability**, ask how the program would support your child throughout the day.
